

December's General Meeting, Thursday, December 15, at 7:30 PM will be hosted by Bob Greenberg, whose work will also be in the Spotlight. Bob is a harpsichord maker and plans to present examples of his fine craftsmanship in various stages of assembly. His work is exquisite; so plan to attend.

Also on the agenda is a Panel Discussion about the business end of woodworking. BAWA members Lewis Buchner, Don Dupont, Chip Galusha, Bob Greenberg, Peter Good, Tim Kennedy, and Mike Laine will address five questions prepared by Bob Newhall and Philo Bemis. Discussion from the floor will be welcome.

Our fellow members will talk about 1) their background and training, 2) the kind of work they do, 3) how they attract customers, 4) how they price their work, and 5) whether or not they get a fair return for their work.



Last, but not least, there will be an election of a new slate of officers. Yes, it's election time again. This is a very important aspect of our organization, one deserving your support, both by running for office and by voting. Please consider volunteering yourself for any of our Executive Committee positions. You don't have to be nominated from the floor.

THE NOVEMBER MEETING was held at the University of California Forest Products Laboratory in Richmond. The Lab staff prepared a series of demonstrations and lectures on Kiln Drying, the Structural Testing of Woods, Wood Identification, and the Development of Particle Board (it can be made 4,000 different ways!). BAWA members with technical problems with either wood or machining are encouraged to call the Lab's extension office to ask for advice. (231-9400)
